### Role Description

The Chair will work with ALS Society of Canada staff to develop and oversee the implementation of ALS Society of Canada's cycling fundraising event. The primary function of their role will be to oversee the effective functioning of the Cycling Committee, serve as an advisor to staff leads and support the overall execution and strategic vision of the event.

### Responsibilities

- Demonstrate leadership
- Support and influence the vision and direction of ALS Society of Canada's Cycling fundraising event, within the mandate of the committee
- Establish and build a strong, effective and a constructive working relationship with staff leads and committee members
- Develop terms of reference for committee, in conjunction with staff leads
- Support ALS Society of Canada on committee recruitment process by lending support on the screening and selection of members
- Serve as the primary liaison between the committee and staff leads
- Utilize personal networks to develop potential partnership and sponsorship opportunities

- Support fundraising efforts and source potential sponsors
- Accountable for budget
- Chair bimonthly committee meetings, inform meeting agendas
- Encourage participant registration within personal network
- Fundraise to the VIP Level
- Attend ALS Society of Canada's Cycling event in spring 2021
- Ensure committee members fulfil their duties and responsibilities
- Mediate any conflicts within the committee, escalate if/when necessary
- Support the development of and abide by the committee terms of reference
- Act as an ambassador for the cause and organization

- Previous experience volunteering as a part of a not for profit/ health charity committee
- Experience leading or supporting charity fundraising events, or experience with cycling events an asset
- Strong understanding of fundraising
- Willingness to leverage personal networks to develop partnership and sponsorship opportunities
- Strong attention to detail and creative problem-solving skills
- Strong English written and verbal communication abilities
- Experience working with people with diverse backgrounds
- Interest in working with and supporting individuals and families affected by ALS
- Ability to attend in-person meeting in Toronto every 2 months (6x/year) and commit an estimated 4-6 hours monthly
